

NPSU STALL AT CONVENTION

420,000 St John branded kits supplied across the country — **3,000,000** units of 189 different components, manufactured and procured from 20 suppliers across 4 countries. NPSU 2017

Amongst the 60 new products developed in 2017, check out some of the new stuff while you're at the Convention:

- an AED cabinet with video options
- a trauma first aid pack
- the modular first aid kit concept
- marine kits and waterproof first aid packs.

Other items on display will include:

- first aid kits for the home and workplace, events, outdoor activities
- first aid consumables, such as dressings, bandages, instruments, cold packs, and gloves
- emergency equipment including spine boards, stretchers, collars, head immobilisers and splints
- specific EHS member products, for example trauma kits and first aid backpacks
- AED stuff! —the machine, the cabinets, trainers, pads and signage
- equipment to assist with patient transfer such as disposable linen, stretchers, etc.

The National Product Sourcing Unit (NPSU), based in Sydney, is part of the Australian office team. The NPSU manages the development, production, freight and distribution of all kits, components, and equipment.

The NPSU has International Standards Organisation (ISO) certification, and all products are registered with Australia's Therapeutic Goods Administration.

And, the NPSU also manages the online shop—where members and the Australian community book their online courses, and buy all their first aid kits, supplies and equipment.

145,000 shop visitors, and over 9000 orders fulfilled, in 2017.
